**CINNAMON SUGAR
DONUTS**

Several tubes of refrigerator biscuits
Mixture of sugar and cinnamon cooking oil
Heat about one and a half inches of cooking oil in the Dutch oven.
Be careful not to allow it to become too hot.

**Heat over coals, NOT
FLAMES!**

Prepare the biscuits by sticking your thumb through them to make a ring.
CAREFULLY drop them from a spoon into the hot oil.
Turn them once.
Remove them from the oil and roll them in the cinnamon and sugar mixture.
